A Note from the CEO

Can you imagine what it would be like to be forcefully removed from your home as a child?

In South Carolina, most children removed from their home are taken out of their school, away from friends and away from social activities. They are often taken to an entirely different county where they do not know anyone.

It's hard for me to fathom the strong feelings of rejection and deep emotional loss for a child who experiences such trauma.

Now the good news! This summer we are celebrating the fact that the number of Miracle Hill foster families has more than doubled! We are now serving over 200 children with foster families in addition to 70 more children in our group homes! Each of our foster families will love on these precious children and share the hope they can find in Jesus.

This is all possible because of your continuing prayer and support. We trust that you'll continue and expand your partnership with us as we grow to help more hurting people become whole.

RESCUE MISSIONS



James, now 52, dropped out of school in the 9th grade and went to work. While living in Florida, his truck and all of his

tools were stolen. He eventually landed at **Greenville Rescue Mission**. James signed up for tutoring and on July 19, 2016 he received his GED certification! As he left the director's office he asked, "Do I look a little taller?" Yes... yes, James, you do.



Although the Cherokee County Rescue Mission is considered an "adult" ministry housing homeless men and women,

it is vibrant and alive with the sounds of children. In the women's wing we currently have several mothers with children - two sisters 9 and 11 - a 6 month old baby boy - a 1 year old girl - and a newborn expected soon. Miracle Hill is the only shelter that allows homeless mothers and children to reside together in Cherokee County.

100 cameras - 100 people affected by homelessness in **Spartanburg** received a



disposable camera with one task - to tell their story. The cameras were turned back in, and the stories captured in photography were amazing. To learn more visit Facebook. com/ThroughOurEyesProject.
