Jeff Lynch Appliance to Host Classic Rock Concert for a Cause

Proceeds to Benefit Miracle Hill Overcomers Addiction Recovery Center

GREENVILLE, SC (September 26, 2019) - Jeff Lynch Appliance and TV Center will host a family-friendly, free concert with classic rock 'n roll band Concealed Damage on October 5, 2019 from 7 – 10 p.m. Donations received at the concert will benefit Miracle Hill Overcomers Center, a 7-month, residential addiction recovery program for men.

"People in recovery need encouragement to stay on track," said Mark Lynch, President of Jeff Lynch Appliance and TV Center and guitarist for Concealed Damage. "Our support of Miracle Hill Overcomers Center is a way we can invest in people's lives and change the future course of families in crisis." In addition to hosting regular benefit concerts, Lynch's company also hires graduates of the Overcomers program to build job skills and work experience.

Each year, the Overcomers Center averages 100 graduates, and more than 65% of them move into transitional housing offered by Miracle Hill. Construction is currently underway for a new transitional housing village called *Miracle Hill at Restoration Way* located directly behind the Overcomers Center. It will allow graduates to remain in close proximity to not only the Center but also jobs, transportation, Celebrate Recovery, and their supporting churches.

Two of the eight houses have been completed, and a drainage pond is currently under construction. The 7-acre community will house up to 48 men and will include a shared greenspace that will be utilized for cookouts, sports and fellowship. Each three-bedroom home will be built to Energy Star efficiency standards with Jeff Lynch Appliance providing appliances for all the homes.

"We are incredibly grateful for the tangible, life-giving support Jeff Lynch Appliance and Concealed Damage provide for our recovery programs," said Reid Lehman, President/CEO of Miracle Hill Ministries.

The benefit concert will be held in the parking lot at <u>Jeff Lynch Appliance and TV Center</u> (17 Roper Mountain Rd. in Greenville) and will feature three hours of classic rock 'n roll music, food vendors, testimonies from Overcomers graduates, and an opportunity to donate. No alcohol will be permitted, and attendees should bring their own lawn chairs.
